

## Condolence meeting in memory of Late Prof. Kalyan Kumar Bhar (Department of Civil Engineering, IIEST Shibpur)

## Condolence meeting in memory of Prof. Kalyan Kumar Bhar

Prof. Kalyan Kumar Bhar, an alumnus, Professor, Dean and former Head of the Civil Engineering Department of the Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology, Shibpur left for heavenly abode on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2021. In order to pay homage to his memory, the Department of Civil Engineering IIEST Shibpur organized a condolence meeting in a hybrid mode (i.e. online and offline), in the departmental Seminar Hall on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2021. All COVID-19 protocols were strictly adhere by in the offline condolence meet.

The condolence meet began at 5 pm with the garlanding of photo frame of Late Prof. Bhar by faculty members and friends, Heads, Deans, staffs and students, followed by observation of one minute of silence thereof. A musical prayer was offered in his fond memory through the eternal Brahma Sangeet of Rabindranath Tagore - "Tomaro Ashime". Prof. Ambarish Ghosh, Head, Department of Civil Engineering delivered the introductory speech, where he reiterated the immense contribution of Prof. Bhar for the Civil Department, as well as for the institute, and his active role in the advancement of the Water Resources specialization. Prof. Ghosh remarked that his sudden demise is a huge loss not only to his family members, but also to the Institute and to his students. This was followed by an emotional condolence speech delivered by Hon'ble Director of the institute, Prof. Parthasarathi Chakrabarti, where he recalled the memories of working with Prof. Bhar and admired his way of handling multiple responsibilities in an efficient manner.
