Curtailing avoidable expenditure : 20% reduction in controllable Subject: expenditure - reg.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to refer to Director (Finance) communication dated 2's June, 2021 forwarding therewith Department of Expenditure's O.M. No. 7(1)E.Coord/2020 dated 10th June, 2021 regarding curtailing all avoidable non-scheme expenditure and aim for 20% reduction in controllable expenditure.

- The Budget Estimates for Financial Year 2021-22 under the Scheme 'Support to NITs and IIEST has been curtailed from Rs.1325.00 crore to Rs.1065.04 crore under OH-31. Since, funds amounting to Rs.306.50 crore have already been disbursed to NITs & IIEST under OH-31 during the first quarter of the current financial year, funds to the tune of Rs.758.54 crore (including HEFA) would, accordingly be available for disbursement during the next three quarters of the financial year. Therefore, Budget allocation of NITs and IIEST Shibpur under OH-31 is also curtailed accordingly.
- In light of the above, all NITs and IIEST Shibpur are requested to review and curtail the avoidable expenditure under the heads indicated in the above
